Petr Kyloušek

Professor Petr Kyloušek, of the Department of Romance Languages and Literatures at Masaryk University in Brno, is among the most accomplished Canadianists in the Czech Republic as well as a leading figure in Canadian Studies in the Central European region and beyond.

Professor Kyloušek has distinguished himself as both a prolific scholar and an indefatigable organizer of Canadian and Québec Studies activities. In the former capacity, his notable accomplishments include the monumental (534 pages) History of Franco-Canadian and Quebec Literature, his work as editor-in-chief of four collections covering a wide range of Québec and Canadian topics, and almost 60 articles and chapters in scholarly journals and collections published throughout the Central European region (Austria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Hungary, Poland, Serbia and Slovakia) as well as in Canada, France, Germany and the Netherlands.

Equally outstanding is Petr Kyloušek's contribution to strengthening Canadian and Québec Studies. Besides taking on various responsibilities in the Central European Association for Canadian Studies, he has used his position as Co-Director of the Canadian Studies Centre at Masaryk University to institutionalize the subject there, playing a key role in the creation of a unique interdisciplinary North American Studies Master's degree in which Canadian and Québec Studies are firmly embedded. Professor Kyloušek has also worked closely on projects involving conferences and publications with colleagues in Hungary, Poland, Germany and Canada, thus fostering fruitful and long-term international cooperation in Canadian and Québec Studies.
